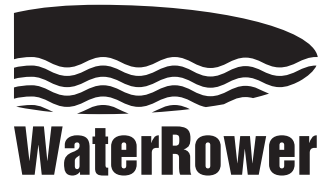
FEATURED ARTIST

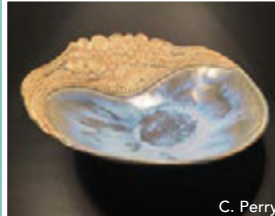

 Laura will host stone carving and weaving demonstrations.

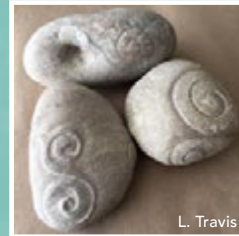

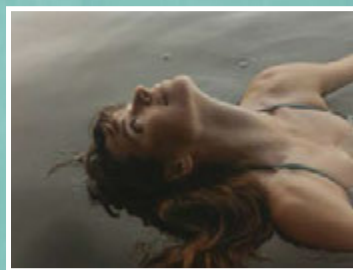

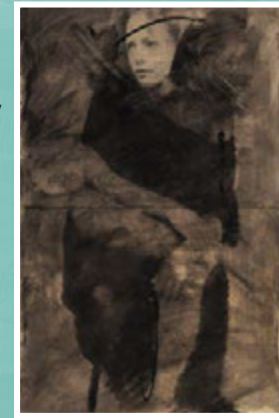
FORT FORECLOSURE 6 164 WATER STREET

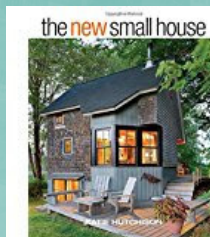
