Welcome to Jail! The Bristol Historical & Preservation Society occupies the former Bristol County Jail, which consists of the 1828 keepers cottage and an 1858 addition. For Art Night, visitors will tour two historic cells where prisoners were kept in the 1820s as well as the austere 8-cell block, complete with bars on the doors.

Tigris Art Gallery's exhibit "Secret Language of Mesopotamia," explores a secret language that Mesopotamian women have been using for



more than 6,000 years as they weave their personal stories, into their carpets and face and body tatoos.

Kurdish visual artist **Selahattin Şep**'s art transforms these ancient symbols and colors into a modern language seen through a cultural lens, as his paintings give voice to long silenced narratives.

In Şep's work, viewers are invited to take a deeper look at the stories and culture of Mesopotamian women.

6 KENDALL REISS GALLERY & STUDIO 469 WOOD STREET

Featuring the work of Alyn Carlson, Tanya Crane and Arpie Gennetian, SURFACE to SUBSTRATE (ON VIEW: July 2 - August 31, 2018) explores the concept of landscape through the lens of three contemporary artists. Works in the exhibition employ a wide variety of media including Carlson's paintings and drawings inspired by the stark Icelandic landscape, delicate paper collages by Gennetian, in combination with Crane's intricate sgraffito enamel jewelry.



WASHINGTON LODGE 12 MASONIC TEMPLE • 39 BAKER ST



The building is on the National Register of Historic Places and an integral part of the Warren Waterfront Historical District. Warren's craftsmen constructed the Federalstyle building with oak

timbers from ships sunk across Newport Harbor in 1770's

The fresco murals on the 2nd floor were selected from the works of "Book of the Dead" & "Papyrus of Ani". Max Muller, a member of the Lodge and RISD graduate, hand painted the murals in 1915.

The Lodge will be open from 6:00 - 8:00 pm.
